

EYFS/KS1 WOW WORK

Nursery and Reception

The children have really enjoyed learning about the Kings Coronation this week, as we explore our own experiences of the Coronation weekend. We have been busy making flags, role playing Kings and Queens, counting the jewels onto the crowns and using puppets in the small world to add to the wonderful castles the children have made in the small world!

Year 1 and Year 2

The children have been busy exploring 2D and 3D shapes this week in maths as our Year 1 children begin to name the shapes and our Year 2 begins to learn about the properties of shapes. In English we have turned into News Reporters as we re-enacted the Kings Coronation as if we were reporting on the event!



KS2 WOW WORK

This week in science the Year 3 and 4 children have been exploring and creating an experiment to investigate the different melting points of materials such as chocolate, marshmallows and butter.

They have created their own method and formed a scientific experiment for their lesson. They then used their knowledge of statistics in mathematics to create a table and bar chart.





The Year 5s have been experimenting reversible and irreversible changes in materials as they have been making their own pizza dough! The children made and cooked their own pizza dough and explained how the change was irreversible as the ingredients cannot be separated after cooked.

They have been working very hard with Mr Cleland and all the children should be very proud of the work that they have completed.
