Total Sports Summer Activities (see attached posters)



Sports Day

On Tuesday 4th July, we will be holding our sports day at Stillington Sports centre. Parents are welcome to join us from 1pm. All pupils require to come to school on their PE kit and bring a packed lunch, if not already ordered from school. We are aware that the Malton transition morning for year 4 and 5 is also taking place on this day. Pupils are welcome to attend the transition event with parents but can we please ask that they are returned to Stillington Sports centre upon return to school. Please can you inform the class teacher if you wish for your child to attend the transition event.

Quidditch Day

On Tuesday 18th July, children in years 1-6 will be taking a trip to Hogwarts for our Quidditch day.

This will take place at Terrington Village Hall. Children from Stillington and Foston will be taken across by bus, which will depart at 9:15am and they will return before the end of the school day.

All children are required to come in their PE kit: white t-shirt, black shorts or jogging bottoms and trainers. Children should also wear their school jumper/cardigan and bring their own, clearly named water bottle. On this day, pupils are required to bring a packed lunch from home or order one from the school office by **Friday 30th June.** The sandwich options are: ham, cheese and tuna.

Children in Nursery and Reception will eat at school as usual.


If anyone has any questions, please direct them to the school office to be passed on to Miss Tordoff.

Bat Survey

This week, we were very lucky to have members of the local community join us to talk about different bat species. We explored the different aspects of Bat life including their habitats and food. Here is what

one of our children had to say:

On Monday 25th June 2023 we had a talk on what bats do and how they communicate, then we went to meadow to plant a device that has a microphone and listens for bat noises which records what species of bat there is in the area. We plan to use this data as part of our curriculum learning of statistics.




The Year 1 and Year 2 children have been exploring sculptures in art by challenging themselves with joining techniques.






KS2 WOW WORK
