

Dance performance






Milton Rooms

Ryedale Eco Fair, Milton Rooms, Saturday 10th June, 10am-3pm (Please see attached posters)

As you may be aware, we are in the process of organising our third annual Eco Fair, to take place at the Milton Rooms on Saturday 10th June, 10-3, to coincide with the Great Big Green Week.

We've been working hard on initiatives to engage more young people at the fair and in what is going on locally to help protect the environment and prepare future generations for the effects of climate change etc.

We would love to see lots of children and young people there on the day, sharing their thoughts with us, doing fun and creative activities, and learning more about the natural world. There will be representatives from local and national environmental charities (including RSPB, Friends of the Earth, and the British Dragonfly Society); stalls selling recycled and handmade arts, crafts, cosmetics and more; the North Yorkshire Rotters (with a wormery workshop!); eco tips, resources and info for families; local groups there to chat about what they're up to; and some indoor and outdoor activities for our younger visitors.

We hope they will go away feeling informed but, most importantly, empowered. We want to help combat the growing problem of eco-anxiety, by showing them what is already being done and how they can turn their negative feelings about the environment into positive action! Perhaps we'll even be able to generate some interest in creating a monthly 'Young REG' group to build on this (we'd love to hear their suggestions for a group name!):-)

So, where do you come in? Well, we've come up with a collaborative project we hope will help encourage engagement from young people in the community, and ignite their creativity and positivity:

Introducing the REG Ocean Art Challenge...

- Indoors on the day of the fair, there will be a corner aimed at families and young people, and we will be joined by amazingly creative people from <u>The Paint Jar</u>, <u>Environmental Art CIC</u> and <u>Be The Future</u>.
- We will be making a 3D coral reef scene as a collaborative art project. The kind of coral reef our oceans deserve! BUT, it will be made from recycled/scrap/junk materials such as plastic bottles and bags, cardboard boxes any (clean) rubbish really!
- The collaborative aspect is where the young people come in. We'd like to invite them to create and bring along something to live on our coral reef could be a fish, crustacean, sea mammal, piece of coral or seaweed, etc.
- All the details are in the attached poster, and we invite you either to incorporate this activity into a lesson within school OR to send out the poster to parents via email/send home with children some other way.
- We have included a link to a Pinterest board we have created, which is packed full of ideas if needed!
- Children can also visit the fair and make their contribution on the day.
- There will be prizes for the three most creative, vibrant and hopeful contributions :-)
- We are even told that we may be able to display the finished sculpture as part of the Malton Sculpture Trail in August!
