





### NURSERY AND RECEPTION (EYFS) (CLASS 1)

This week the children have had a week exploring Autumn! We have enjoyed an Autumn walk as we searched for signs of Autumn, collecting sicks and

vellow, brown and orange leaves to add to our Autumn exploration tray. In maths Reception have been creating repeating patterns using conkers, pinecones, leaves and acorns. Whilst Nursery have matched these objects and explained why they match talking about size and colour. We have loved making leaf necklaces as we develop our fine motor skills. In English the children have been exploring what animals eat through Autumn as they prepare for Hibernation.
