## **Parent Governor Election Result**

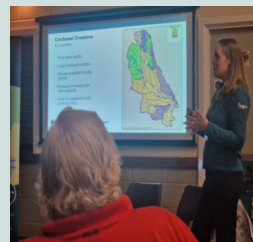
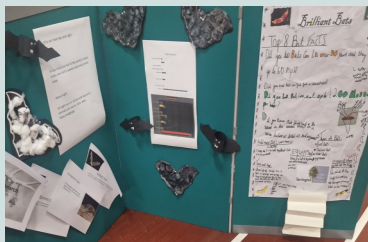

## **NURSERY AND RECEPTION (EYFS) (CLASS 1)**

This week the children have continued exploring Autumn! To continue our interest in Hibernation animals, we have created a 'Hibernation Home' using recycled boxes and leaves collected from our Autumn walk. The children have had great fun deciding which animals hibernate and which do not.

In maths Reception have been creating repeating patterns using conkers, pinecones, leaves and acorns, correcting the mistakes in the patterns. Whilst Nursery have played snap with autumn objects which have been hidden in our sensory tray. To challenge our fine motor, the children have used tweezers to pick up the autumnal coloured pom poms to match them to the autumn leaves. On our creation station we have been feeling the textures of the fallen leaves as we stick them to our trees.



## **KS1 (CLASS 2)**

We have had a great last week of half term. In music, the children have performed in an ensemble using expression in their voices. They sang to the song 'Spaceman'.

On Fantastic Friday, we worked together to learn about the Hindu festival, Holi, and shared our learnings with the rest of the schools across the federation.
