To ensure the safety of all and safeguarding of children, please can we ask that only parents/carers use the exit button when leaving the school site. Thank you.


Lost Property

Operation Encompass





This allows us to provide appropriate support to any child who may have been affected by the incident, whether directly or indirectly. The information shared with the school is confidential and will only be used to support the child's welfare and well-being.

As a school, we are committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for all our students. Operation Encompass helps us to identify and respond to any potential issues promptly, ensuring that the necessary support is in place for those who need it most.

This week the children have been learning about Doctors and Nurses and how they help us. They have really enjoyed role playing the different roles in a hospital!




KS1 (CLASS 2)
