What an incredible term we have had at Terrington C of E primary school! Our pupils have been extremely busy broadening their minds across a range of topics. Pupils have enjoyed learning about plants, British sign language and creating collages in KS2 alongside becoming writers of historical fiction through their narrative creation based on Goodnight Mr Tom.

KS1 have learnt about Nelson Mandela and the impact he had on bringing about change. In science, they explored seasonal changes and what happens during different months as well as how to dress appropriately for them.
