Breakfast Club Changes

Year 1 Phonics Screening week commencing 10th June.

The year 1 children will take their statutory phonics screening assessments, where they will use their phonics knowledge to read 40 real and non real words. The assessment will take place with a myself (Mrs Rutherford) and the children will have as long as they need to read the words. They have completed a few practice tests and have been revising all our phonics graphemes and phonemes in preparation for this test so I have every confidence that the children will have nothing to worry about! Year 2 SATS

The children in year 2 will be completing Key Stage 1 SATS in mid June. They will be doing reading, SPAG, and Maths papers. They have been working hard to prepare for these and will do amazing! 






KS2 (CLASS 3)
