FST Olympics (Sports Day)

On Tuesday 2nd July, **ALL children from Nursery to Year 6 will be taking part in our sports day.**

This will take place at Terrington Village Hall. Children from Stillington and Foston will be taken across by bus, which will leave school immediately after registration. Parents and families are invited to join us from 1 o'clock and may take their children home with them when sports day has finished roughly around 2:30pm. Buses will still be provided for those children who need them and will return to school before the end of the school day.

All children should come to school in their PE kit, which is a white t-shirt, black shorts or jogging bottoms and trainers. Children should also wear their school jumper/cardigan and bring their own, clearly named water bottle. Please can we also ask that pupils bring a sun hat and sun cream is applied before school (a labelled bottle can also be brought with them).

There will be **NO hot school dinners** on this day for everyone, so packed lunches of sandwiches will be provided. **If you would like to order a school packed lunch for your child, please let the school office know by Monday 17th June**, so that we can order supplies in good time. Sandwich filling choices are ham, cheese or tuna mayo. If you do not want a school packed lunch, then please provide one for your child, as there will be no other option on this day.

If you plan to attend, please bring your own chair!

Nursery children who do not attend nursery on Tuesdays are also invited to join us. If your child would like to come for the day or the afternoon, please let the class teacher know.

For our Fantastic Friday on July 12th the children will be travelling to Stillington School to learn about water and fire safety from some visiting speakers. Following on from the success of our Everybody's cycling bike try outs last year, the children will also be learning

The children will be travelling by bus, which will be leaving at 9:15 and will return at 2:35. Please can all children come to school in their PE kit. Helmets will be provided, however if your child wishes to bring one, they can, but please make sure it is clearly labelled with

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme** this term. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children in Y2 and Y5/6. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy.

Parents and carers are asked to let school know if their child may have experienced anything (in the past or happening now) which may mean they need extra support before, during or after taking part in this programme.
